It was proposed by Mr J. H. Marshall seconded by Mr W. B. Clarke & carried unanimously that Mr A. Thorntow be appointed Chairman of the meeting.

The Chairman took the Chair at 6:5 P. M. and called for nomination papers of candidates for Election as Parish Councillors which were numbered as handed in.

being one of the acts referred to as Adaptive Act by the local Government Act 1894. Upon the proposition being put to the meeting 24 votes were given for it and 4 against it. It was therefore decided March 1896. to be carried.

Mr Thornton proposed and Mr See Bance seconded, "that the Parish Council be requested to take the necessary steps for doing away with the Pond in front of the school."

Mr J. Baker moved and Mr C. Dyford seconded an amendment "that the Pond be not done away with," and a vote being taken the amendment was carried.

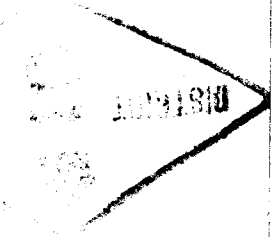
